**Anneke Ribberink** is Associate Professor of Political History at VU University Amsterdam. Her doctoral dissertation dealt with the origins of the Dutch second feminist wave: *‘Leidsvrouwen en zaakwaarneemsters’*. *Een geschiedenis van de Aktiegroep Man Vrouw Maatschappij (MVM), 1968-1973*, Hilversum: Verloren, 1998; (*Leading ladies and cause minders; A history of the Pressure Group Man Woman Society*). Since then she has been investigating the lives and careers of famous female politicians in the West after 1945. She already published several times on Margaret Thatcher (UK) and Gro Harlem Brundtland (Norway).

**Anna Schober** is currently a Visiting Professor at Verona University/ Italy financed by the EU, Seventh Framework Programme, Marie Curie Actions. She received her Ph.D. as well as her postdoctoral habilitation at the University of Vienna and has conducted several research projects on the aesthetic and political dimensions of the public sphere, pop-culture and new social movements.

The story of this hidden past told through the voice of a former GDR Olympic swimmer. The novel will be published in 2012.
